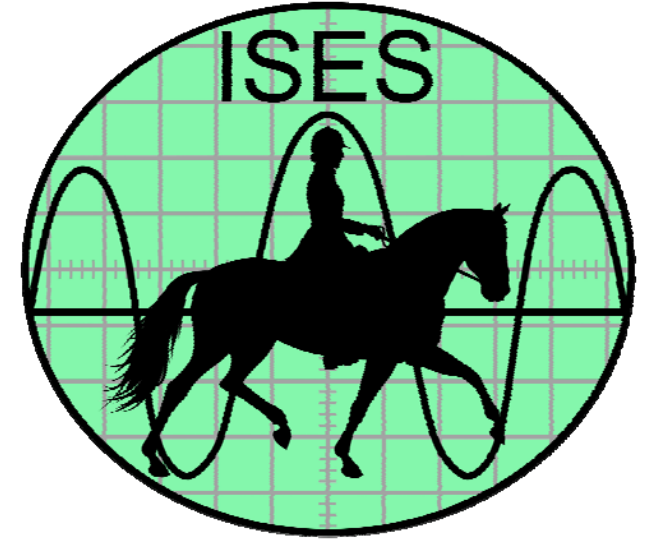

Equitation Science – The application of scientific methods to assess the welfare of horses undergoing training.

ISES Aims

- provide a pool of expertise to national and international governments, industry and to equine welfare organisations which deal with problems involving equine behaviour, training and welfare.
- encourage the assimilation of scientific knowledge so as to facilitate its use in relation to practical problems concerning horse training and management.
