ISES provides an international forum in which scientists communicate their recent findings by organising scientific meetings and by encouraging scientific publications. Furthermore, the Society offers a pool of expertise to national governments, international bodies, industry and equine welfare organisations.

ISES Aims

- encourage and support research into the training and welfare of horses
- provide an international forum for communicating scientific results by organising meetings and by encouraging scientific publications
- encourage links between applied animal behaviour science, veterinary science, psychology and other disciplines
- encourage and support the teaching of equitation science in academic institutions, e.g. veterinary schools, departments of animal science, laboratory, companion or captive animals, animal production, agricultural colleges
- provide a pool of expertise to national and international governments, industry and to equine welfare organisations which deal with problems involving equine behaviour, training and welfare
- encourage the assimilation of scientific knowledge so as to facilitate its use in relation to practical problems concerning horse training and management

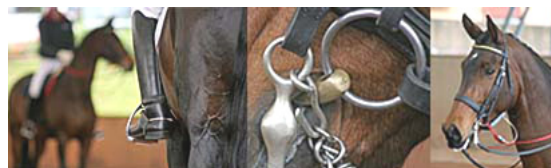

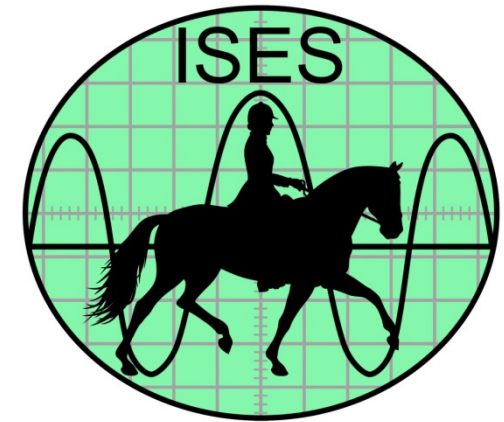
