





# 'A Good Life for Horses'

Conference Information

I hope you are well. Its only 2 weeks to go before we meet everyone in New Zealand, and to help you with your planning, the following information and advice is provided:

## Transfers from Airports to Hamilton or Cambridge.

Cambridge is relatively easy to access by road if you choose to hire a car. The best alternative is to take a bus - Bus information can be found here <a href="https://www.intercity.co.nz/north-island-buses/bus-to-cambridge">https://www.intercity.co.nz/north-island-buses/bus-to-cambridge</a> so that you can plan your journey. There are no direct planes from Auckland Airport, however if you land in Wellington, you will find a connection to Hamilton, and you can then take a bus ride from there to Cambridge. There are no train networks available.

The Bus stop in the Centre of Cambridge is referred to as Cambridge i-SITE

#### Accommodation

We hope that you have been able to use the many booking sites (eg Booking.com; bookabach etc) to find suitable accommodation in Cambridge or Hamilton or close by. If you haven't already booked accommodation, I suggest you do so soon.

**Please fill in this form only if you require a bus service** to and from the ISES conference in Cambridge, NZ 14th-16th March. The bus service will run from Hamilton, via Cambridge Centre to the Conference venue. If you have your own transport, you do not need to complete the registration form.
